#### **CHECK-OUT at the end of the live auction**

Volunteers will be working to organize your winnings during the live auction. Please wait until the close of the live auction to check out. You will check out, pay for, and take your winning items with you tonight. Once the auction is over, you will receive your personalized receipt when exiting the hall. After making your payment in cash, check, or by credit card, volunteers will hand you your winnings!

## *Auction Bidding: How it Works...*

- ◆ Register for a bidding number when entering the hall. You may use this number to bid both in the silent auction and live auction.
- ◆ To bid on an item in the silent auction, write your bidder number and your bid dollar amount on the item's bid card.
- ◆ To bid on an item in the live auction, raise your paddle with your bidder number when the auctioneer calls an amount that you would like to bid. If you are the winning bidder, please keep your paddle raised until your number is called and your bid is recorded.
- ◆ All auction sales are final and items are "as is". We are unable to grant exchanges or refunds. Please note any special restrictions, limitations, or black-out dates before bidding.
- ◆ Services must be redeemed within one year of the auction date, unless otherwise specified. Please schedule appointments or arrangements directly with the donor.
- ◆ Please note, we regard your purchase as a confidential transaction between yourself and our organizations, however, in some cases, it may be necessary for us to provide a donor with your contact information in order to redeem your item or service.
- ◆ Purchases are expected to be paid for and taken from the Opera House on the night of the auction, unless other special arrangements have been made. You will be responsible for paying for all items on which you are the winning bidder.

## LIVE AUCTION CAUSE: KILN FOR THE STUDIO PROGRAM

The Library Arts Center's studio program offers hundreds of students of all ages a variety of studio arts classes all year long. We are proud that our studio is equipped to work as a ceramics studio, as well as a painting and drawing studio. We have had a great demand for ceramics classes for both children and adults. It has become clear that our aging kiln, which we use in every ceramics class we offer, is ready to retire. Kiln technology has improved greatly over the past few decades. Kilns are now commonly computerized, firing clay pieces efficiently and safely - making the process less strenuous on the instructor, and ensuring a uniform outcome with less broken pottery as a result of firing. Not only will a new kiln improve what we are able to do in our studio, and the number of ceramics classes we are able to offer, it will also take away the safety concerns we have with our current, aging kiln. Kilns are expensive. We have been working with local potters to find a relatively new, second-hand kiln that is in very good shape. Funds raised tonight will be used to purchase this kiln. **Estimated cost of a gently used kiln: \$3,000**

## SILENT AUCTION CAUSES

STUDIO SCHOLARSHIPS for CHILDREN — During the summer months, we have over 20 classes and workshops available for school-aged children. This program offers a wonderful variety of enriching and engaging arts opportunities for youth in the community. We work hard to keep tuition as low as possible to ensure that our studio classes are accessible to everyone. With that said, there is tremendous need for studio scholarships for children. We try to never turn a student away who wants to come to the studio! Your donation of \$20 will provide a scholarship for one child to attend a studio class this summer, or for two children to receive partial scholarships. **Approx. Annual Cost: \$1,000.**

STUDIO EASELS — Artists of all ages are always setting up studio easels for classes, and these easels are old and are beginning to break beyond repair. A new studio easel costs \$75. Your donation of \$25 to this fund will pay for 1/3 of a new easel. Easels will be purchased and put to use immediately following this event, as donations permit. **Total Cost: \$750.**

CHAIRS — If you have attended a concert, talk or event at the Library Arts Center, you have probably noticed that our chairs have seen better days (they are from 1967)! Despite our efforts to clean and repair the chairs, they are breaking at an alarming rate. This concern, which was originally aesthetic, is now a safety concern as well. After much research, the Board of Trustees has found comfortable, durable, and affordable stacking chairs. Your donation of \$22 will purchase one gallery event chair. **Total Cost: \$1,650.**

## Centerpiece Artists

### ANNE BOISVERT

Anne has studied pottery with David Pellerin at Wellhouse Farm Pottery in Springfield, NH since 2005. Before that, she attended classes at the Manchester Institute of Art. She currently lives in New London. One of the places you can find Anne's ceramic work is the Library Arts Center's gallery during the annual *Gallery of Gifts*, the Newport Town Common during the *Apple Pie Crafts Fair*, or the *Market on the Green* on the New London Common.

### CORY BEVILACQUA

Cory Bevilacqua grew up in Goshen and still lives there today with his wife and son. Cory owns Bevilacqua Welding, and has created many beautiful pieces on commission from iron railings for stairs, to a custom-made flat iron vessel. Cory also welds for Sturm, Ruger & Company.

### TRISH DALTO

Trish began blowing glass in 1989 when she was a student at Franklin Pierce College in New Hampshire. In 1995, she started her own glass studio as co-owner of North Country Glass. During the years that followed, North Country Glass sold pieces to galleries locally and across the country. She is currently in business for herself, and her gallery space in Washington, NH is open to the public during open house events. Trish is also a juried member of the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen.

### ROSALIE des GROSEILLIERS

Rosalie des Groseilliers holds a Bachelor of Science in Art Education from the University of New Hampshire and a Master of Arts in Educational Administration from Saint Mary's College of California. She considers the medium of watercolor to be her passion, and has been painting, teaching and taking watercolor classes for over 40 years. She currently finds herself painting gardens, scenic Vermont and the occasional wolf, as well as commissioned paintings. You will find art work, original watercolors, prints and hand-painted glassware on display and for sale in her studio in Hardwick, VT.

### DAVID ERNSTER

David Ernster has a Bachelor of Fine Arts in metalsmithing and jewelry, as well as a Masters of Fine Arts in Ceramics. David, a resident of Newbury, NH, is currently employed by MJ Harringtons and Colby Sawyer College. You can see several of his pieces currently on display in the Library Arts Center gallery as part of the *Juried Regional Exhibit*.

### SHARON PARSONS

Sharon Parsons lives in Sunapee with her husband and four children. Since learning from her grandmother at a young age, she has been creating pottery and baskets for the past 25 years. She has a studio in her home and teaches lessons while also selling her work at the Wild Goose Shop in Sunapee Harbor.

RUSSELL POTTERY AT CHALK POND

Sue and Steve Russell have a lifelong passion for the arts that has been the driving force in their work as ceramic artists. Their pieces are wheel-thrown, and they enjoy living in New Hampshire where they believe that nature nurtures much of their studio work. The Russells are juried members of the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen and members of the New Hampshire Potters Guild.

DAVID PELLERIN of WELLHOUSE FARM POTTERY

Wellhouse Farm Pottery is the production studio of New Hampshire Artist, David Pellerin. He creates both unique and functional high fire porcelain, stoneware and raku pottery. In addition to David's own work, the facility was designed for the instruction of beginner through advanced potters in a workshop setting. Independent study and studio rental are also available. The Wellhouse Farm Pottery clay mixing facility produces high quality porcelains and stonewares that are used by both professional potters and educational institutions throughout New England. David is a juried member of the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen. David's piece is displayed without flowers tonight as part of the silent auction.

SAM WILD

Sam Wild is a graduate of Ohio University in Athens, Ohio, where he earned both Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Fine Arts. In 1971, he established a home and studio in Porter Place of Andover, NH, and lived there for 31 years before moving to Wilmot, NH in 2002. Since 1971, Sam has had a booth at the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen's annual fair at Mount Sunapee. The fair, along with sales from his shop at his home and number of League of New Hampshire Craftsmen shops, constitute the primary retail outlets for his work.
